Mental Wellness with LaTasha Anderson

On November 28th, LaTasha Anderson, Licensed Professional Counselor, led a discussion on mental wellness at our General Membership Meeting. The discussion focused on grief and loss, highlighting the losses that we typically do not think of as warranting grief, such as moving/loss of home, loss of a job, estrangement from family, loss when an adult child gets married (because the nature of the relationship between parent and child changes), or loss of meaningful objects. She emphasized the things that are important for caring for your mental health, including 1. getting good sleep

- 2. eating well/getting nutrition, through supplements if necessary
- 3. exercise, such as walking 4. getting outside 5. connection to friends/family
- 6. spending time with hobbies/interests 7. faith practices and
- 8. disconnecting from social media. She shared a mindfulness exercise that helps to bring one's attention to the present moment (useful in lessening anxiety and anger). The exercise involves naming 5 things you can see, 4 things you can hear, 3 things you can touch, 2 things you can smell, and 1 thing you can taste in that moment. She also recommended deep breathing as a helpful relaxation technique.

Captain Edmonds of the Hampton PD was gracious enough to correspond with the Newsletter staff regarding security issues in the neighborhood, specifically security cameras and their efficaciousness. On the topic of the security camera the FCA maintains at the front of the neighborhood, while he didn't feel it was his place to specifically endorse the time/money the FCA spends maintaining the camera, he did say that cameras like the one at the front of the neighborhood had the following benefits:

- Deter certain criminal activities
- Provide investigatory leads
- Establish time-of-day crime timelines
- Identify subjects who are involved in criminal activities
- Identify vehicles utilized in criminal activities
- Assist in solving crimes that have already been committed



The Captain also endorsed the continued use of Ring security cameras for those residents who already own them, as the PD has a proven record of establishing leads from these cameras. Captain Edmonds also made it clear that the PD is happy to attend General Membership meetings of the FCA.
