Hampton City Treasurer addresses FCA membership

Christine Snead, Hampton City Treasurer

Christine Snead featured as our guest speaker of the Feb 26th FCA General Membership meeting at the Northampton Community Center. She discussed some basics about her office and answered questions from the community. Snead explained that her office was in charge of collecting fees and taxes for the city, that June 5th and Dec 5th were always the deadlines for Real Estate and Personal Property taxes, and that incremental payments were possible for those residents who have trouble budgeting for two larger payments each year. Any delay in payment will incur a 10% fee, and after 30 days, interest will be charged. Eventually, liens will be issued (last year, more than 30k were sent out!)

Snead answered questions about boots on cars, her office's ability to issue new passports, and which credit cards are accepted as payment for taxes. Following Snead, police community engagement officers talked about the state of public safety in Hampton.
